SCHEDULING

- Your junior year in high school is pivotal. There are numerous decisions that you make during your junior year that can have an impact- positive or negative-for years to come.
- ► Think about where you want to be after High School work, military, college... Set SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Timely); use our <u>Academic Planning Guide</u> as a learning tool. Choose courses that you want to take.

Consider the following when selecting courses:

- Interest What you like
- Ability Can you do it
- Effort How much are you willing to do
- Realism Do your current grades/effort support your choice (BE HONEST)
- Teachers Ask them to guide
- Graduation Will you have what you need to graduate

Course Selection

- You should talk to your teachers about recommendations for your required courses.
- You will choose electives and other academic courses. The Academic Planning Guide is available online.
- Your schedule is created based on what you requested. If you request the wrong classes, then your schedule will be incorrect. Pay attention to what you are scheduling for! <a>©
- If you sign up for a wrong class or change your mind, there could be a chance that you get closed out of the class that you really wanted.

Student Course Load

- Every student must be enrolled in the following each semester:
 - At least five credits of coursework
 - May select up to 6 credits

Things to Think About...

- Colleges and universities are more likely to consider you if you take an extra Science (4), and a World Language (2) beyond core requirements.
- Taking college prep courses above the core helps to offset lower ACT/SAT scores and/or lower class rank.
- Solid course work makes you a more competitive applicant for admission and scholarships.

Things to Think About...(Continued)

- Solid coursework will better prepare you for college placement tests, less chance of having to take remedial college courses.
- Taking a full load of classes keeps you eligible for the Ohio Athletic Association.
- Last opportunity for "free" education where you can explore new subject matter.
- Solid coursework prepares you for the academic rigor of college courses.

- Remediation Free Score
 - Another way to meet testing requirements is by earning a remediation free score in English Language Arts and Math on a nationally recognized college admission exam. The state of Ohio will pay one time for all 11th grade students in the class of 2020 and beyond to take the exam free of charge.
- Industry Credential Workforce Score
 - Industry-recognized credential or group of credentials in a single career field and achieve a workforce readiness score on the WorkKeys assessment.

Schedule Change Requests

- Adding a Class
 - Year long classes can be added up until the 5th day of school.
 - Semester long classes can be added up until the 5th day of class
- Dropping a Class
 - Student may receive a "U" if dropped before first grading period.
 - Student may receive an "F" if dropped after the 1st grading period

 - If you are requesting a level change (i.e moving from Honors Geometry to Geometry), you will need to complete Level Change Request Form.

- The Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and the American College Test (ACT) are the two most widely used admissions tests for four-year colleges and universities. Some colleges require the SAT while others require the ACT, so check the application requirements for the colleges you're considering.
 - You will be taking the SAT as juniors.

- Work Experience-paid or volunteer, year-round or summer—can help you identify career interests and goals, gain work experience, and apply classroom learning to the real world.
- Community Service-You can gain skills and experience through volunteer work, such as by tutoring elementary school kids or spending time at a local hospital.

Athletic/Extracurricular Eligibility

- In order for a student to be eligible for participation, the following must be met:
 - During the grading period immediately preceding participation in the activity, the student must have received passing grades in courses which accumulate to 5.0 credits for the year.
 - During the grading period immediately preceding participation in the activity, the student must have earned a minimum 1.75 grade-point average.

Athletic Eligibility Con't

- If you are planning on playing Division 1 or Division 2 sports at the college level, remember to register with NCAA by the end of junior year.
- We will send your end of junior year transcript.
