Course Description:

Algebra I is designed to provide a solid foundation for all future work in mathematics. The major emphasis is placed on the measuring of mathematical structures. A strong background in fractions, decimals, and variable and logical reasoning is essential. This course covers material that will be tested by the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT).

Materials Needed EVERYDAY:

- Covered textbooks
- Pencils with erasers or a working pen, 1 dry erase marker (optional)
- 3 ring binder (preferably 1.5") with loose-leaf paper and 3 dividers-labeled Notes, Homework, Tests/Quizzes
- A Graphing Calculator is recommended (TI-83 or TI-84) but minimally you will need a Scientific Calculator equivalent to a TI 30 II XS; \$13. (If you own one, make sure it has sin, cos, tan, square root, and probability capabilities. Please mark with your name in permanent marker.)

Daily Homework:

- Homework is to be completed prior to the start of class.
- All work must be shown in PENCIL and be legible.
- Homework may be collected and graded for completion or accuracy at any time throughout the year.
- Daily homework must be labeled in the upper right hand corner with the following information: full name, date, period, and assignment.
- Homework will be assigned daily. It will be graded using completion, accuracy, and
 a homework check sheet. Homework check sheets can assess homework from <u>any</u>
 previous assignment and will be worth 2 points per question. Once the sheet is filled
 in, the lowest score is dropped and the total is entered as a quiz grade.
- An unexcused absence will result in a grade of zero for the homework check sheet question given on that day. For excused absences, it is the student's responsibility to get their check sheet and complete it.

Quizzes/Tests:

- Quizzes may or may not be announced.
- There will be a test at the end of every chapter.
- There will be a day of review before every test. **If you are absent on the day of review**, you are still responsible for taking the test on the scheduled day.
- No sharing of calculators during quizzes and tests.
- If you are absent on a quiz or test day, you need to get a pass from me to make the
 test/quiz up during your study hall. If you do not have a study hall, it is <u>your</u>
 <u>responsibility</u> to see me before or after class to set a day after school for the
 quiz/test to be made up.

Throughout the year, there may be other assignments (i.e. group projects, binders) that will still count as a quiz or test grade. More detailed information and rubrics regarding these assignments will be given out as the projects are assigned.
