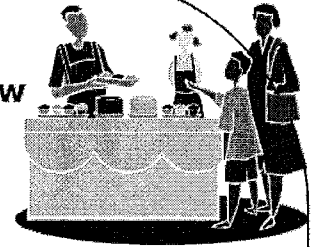


Personal Pronouns

Personal pronouns are used to represent people. They can show first person (the speaker), second person (the person being spoken to), or third person (the person being spoken about).



If the pronoun is the subject of the sentence, we say it is a subject pronoun (sometimes called a nominative pronoun). If the pronoun is the object of the sentence, we say it is an object pronoun.

Person	Subject Pronouns – Singular	Subject Pronouns - Plural
1 st	I	We
2 nd	You	You
3 rd	He/She/It	They

Person	Object Pronouns – Singular	Object Pronouns - Plural
1 st	Me	Us
2 nd	You	You
3 rd	Him/Her/It	Them

Possessive Pronouns



Possessive pronouns show that something belongs to someone or something.

If the shoes belong to me, they are **my** shoes. They are **mine**.

If the car belongs to you, it is **your** car. It is **yours**.

If the books belong to her, they are **her** books. They are **hers**.

If the pencil belongs to him, it is **his** pencil. It is **his**.

If the leaf belongs to the plant, it is **its** leaf.

If the food belongs to us, it is **our** food. It is **ours**.

If the house belongs to them, it is **their** house. It is **theirs**.
